#### **EUROSTUDENT VII – Final Conference**

18<sup>th</sup> - 19<sup>th</sup> May 2021

The conference is the main project event and serves to showcase and discuss the results and insights achieved through EUROSTUDENT by bringing together the involved stakeholders, researchers, and project teams, as well as interested project-external participants.

The conference will mark the launch of the first version of the EUROSTUDENT VII final report – a one-of-a kind comparative publication on the social and economic conditions of student life in Europe. A finalised version including the discussions during the event will be published a few months afterwards.

Contributions by national EUROSTUDENT teams, stakeholders, as well as external researchers, complement the comparative perspective by providing in-depth insights based on research and policy into specific topics, additional analyses, and/or national interpretation and perspectives.

Two newly published thematic reviews will highlight specific topics of interest. The first one focuses on 'Flexible pathways into and within higher education', the other provides a micro data-based analysis of students' social integration.

The event also marks the publication of the first EUROSTUDENT Scientific Use File, which makes the data collected in the project's seventh round available for further analyses by interested researchers and stakeholders worldwide. The database of indicators will also be launched and introduced through workshops.

In this way, the event serves to further the understanding of the social and economic conditions of student life in Europe, and to inspire discussions about practices in using EUROSTUDENT data and results to inform and improve higher education policy at the national and European level.
